## Transforming a library to an officespace

#### Context:

As part for a new university strategy to save costs, the *Department of Arts and Cultural Science* decided to downscale their use of space. As a consequence, the library was reduced, moved and integrated with the central faculty library. This gave space in the former library building to be transformed into a multifunctional space for the administrative.

### The co-working space

The former library is today a coworking office space with casual meeting boxes, a department meeting room, storage room, staff lounge and staff kitchen. All activities bathing in light from the double and triple high ceilings with façade windows allowing the light and view over the city to give the space a strong character.
















#### Context


As part of a university strategy to create a South Campus with diversity, The University, along with Danish Building and Property Agency commissioned new buildings to be added on The South Campus, for the Department of Humanities, department of Law and the Department of Theology.


The architects assigned to projects were Arkitema Architects. The first building was finished in 2003 and consisted of 37000 sqm of educational space for the faculty of humanities.

In 2017 the department of Law and the department of Theology along with the former Library School, moved into the final building mass, containing 48000 Sqm of learning and education space.

In 2014 I came onboard the project as the architect responsible to designing the common spaces shared by the departments along with the interior space for the former Library school whom were transforming into the Department of Information Studies under The Faculty of Humanitie











For the Department of information studies the Library were the Center of learning and therefor also the heart of the space they occupy.




